

# EMT-Intermediate Program

## Admissions Checklist

**Program Filing Deadlines are:**  
July 15/fall semester; November 30/spring semester

### Overview of checklist:

- Step 1. Complete an OTC application.
- Step 2. Complete an application for the EMT-Intermediate program.
- Step 3. Distribute three reference forms. All references will be kept confidential.
- Step 4. Order transcripts.
- Step 5. Provide copy of Missouri EMT-Basic license.
- Step 6. Submit documentation of CPR certification, work experience, vaccinations, and other items listed on the Candidate Selection Form.
- Step 7. Applicants who have met all requirements may be selected for an interview.

- Step 1.** Complete an Ozarks Technical Community College application if not currently enrolled. As required by OTC Admissions policy, take the ASSET or COMPASS placement test if ACT scores are not available. Picture ID is required for the test.
- Step 2.** Complete an application for the EMT-Intermediate program. Submit with a nonrefundable \$15 application fee (check, money order or cash) to the Allied Health Office. Make checks payable to OTC.
- Step 3.** Distribute three reference forms to individuals who are able to comment on your academic potential, work performance, or potential to function in a healthcare field. References may be mailed or hand delivered to OTC's Allied Health Office. If we do not receive your application by the deadline, we will only keep your references for six months.
- Step 4.** Request high school transcript if a first-time student; otherwise, request all college transcripts. Send **ALL** transcripts to:

Transcripts must be official, which means that they must be sent from the schools directly to OTC; they cannot be delivered by students. GED recipients need to bring in a copy of their certificate to the Allied Health Office.

- Step 5.** Provide a copy of current Missouri EMT-Basic license.
- Step 6.** The EMT-Intermediate is a selective admission program and admission is determined by a points-based system. Points are awarded based on work experiences, references, and certifications. Please refer to the Candidate Selection Form for more information.

**Step 7.**

Letters are mailed out indicating acceptance or nonacceptance into the program. Accepted students offered a position in the class receive forms for immunizations and information regarding CPR certification. Please notify the Allied Health Office of any changes in address, name, or phone number.

Before beginning specific Intermediate classes, a **Missouri** EMT license must be obtained if certification was obtained in another state.
