Employment experience credit option available. All students are required to pass a comprehensive program exit examination to graduate.

Students holding a CCS/CCS-P are eligible for a credit hour waiver towards RHIT requirements.

Note: Courses may be available seated and/or online. All courses may not be offered every semester.

All courses must be completed with a grade of “C” or higher.
