Tool and supply list - from Alpha Catalog, you can spend more for quality or shop around and spend less. If you are a beginner, it is not necessary to buy the most expensive tools; you will be a little hard on them at first. Don't be afraid to use tools you already have, buy used, re-purpose tools or make your own tools.

You may borrow saw frames, heat pads, torches and assorted tools from me during class. I will provide a "wish list" for setting up your home studio in a later class - the attached list is only basic supplies for this class.

Flux - melts at 600f protects to

(I like "Handy" brand) - \$8.00
Portable propane or butane torch

Non-asbestos fire proof pad or
fire brick \$5.00 to \$15.00
(do NOT get the "honeycomb"
type with tiny holes in it)
2oz to 4oz ball peen or cross

Emery or polishing paper \$10.00-
PAPER not emery cloth- 3M makes
the best - it is Wetordry Tri-M-
Ite Polishing paper. It is
available from Rio Grande
catalog in a set of 12 sheets
ranging from 400 grit to 8000
grit. ANY wet or dry polishing
paper in at least 3 grades
Approximately 320 grit, 600 grit
and 1,500 grit will do.
